# Expected Outputs from the 5<sup>th</sup> RWG-B Meeting

After nearly four years of implementation, the UNDP/GEF Yellow Sea Project has completed its first two major outputs, the Transboundary Diagnostic Analysis (TDA), and the drafting of the Regional Strategic Action Programme (SAP).

At the Fifth Regional Working Group – Biodiversity (RWG-B) Meeting, members and participants will:

- review the completed and on-going activities under the Biodiversity Component from 2008 to 2009;
- review the biodiversity management actions as set out in the SAP and select which one should be demonstrated;
- suggest how the management actions could be implemented at the demonstration sites;
- suggest activities required to implement the SAP management actions to help draft the 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase Project Document
- and discuss and agree on future activities to implement.

\*\*\* Major output will be the selection of SAP management actions for demonstration and plans on how to implement them at the demonstration sites and scientific and technical inputs for the 2<sup>nd</sup> phase project document. \*\*\*
