- Regional Strategic Action Programme (SAP) preparation***
- CBA of demonstration activities****
- National Strategic Action Plan (NSAP) preparation

- ** The training workshop for data and information management may be organised in 2008, if not in late 2007.

- *** The SAP preparation includes the political and social acceptance analysis as well as the cost-benefit analysis (CBA) of management actions which are politically and socially important.
- **** The cost-benefit analysis of some of selected demonstration activities should be conducted in 2008 to show the efficiency of the activities.
